Besides of the mental pressure, soldiers were confronted to the harsh tropical climate (extreme heat, monsoon, red dust) and were constantly threatened by poisonous creatures (snakes, scorpions, spiders, leeches).12. Lieutenant Dan's family tradition is that a member of his family has fought and died in every single American War.14. Who was the Charlie they were looking for? Charlie is an American slang nickname that stands for Viet Cong enemies.15. Lt. Dan calls in an air-strike. They are going to Nape the area. Nape is a nickname for Napalm - What is napalm? How would war protestors back home use this issue to help make their case against this war? Napalm is a mixture of a gelling agent and petroleum. As images of bombed villages were published, napalm's deadly effects created public outrage in the U.S.. When it was proved that napalm killed innocent civilians, war protestors used this issue to denounce America's interference in the internal conflict of a foreign country and criticized its entanglement in this quagmire by showing that the Vietnam War was morally unjust.16. It might seem random that Gump learns ping-pong; but there was actually Ping Pong Diplomacy. Look this up, learn about it, and write a paragraph summarizing what it was and why it was important. Ping-pong diplomacy refers to the exchange of table tennis players between the United States and China in the early 1970s. It facilitated the beginning of a friendlier relationship between the US and China. The U.S. table tennis players were among the first Americans to visit China.17. Gump meets Nixon and shows him his wound - what years was Nixon the President? 1969-1974.18. There was a protest at the Capital that Gump gets swept into what were they protesting? Gump gets swept into an anti-war protest criticizing America's involvement in the Vietnam War.19. In addition to the hippies what other social-reform group does Gump meet during this time (introduced by Jennie)? The Black Panther Party.20. Find a reliable source on the Black Panthers. When were they most active? Name some of their leaders. What was their purpose? Does this group still exist today? The Black Panther Party (1966-1982) was a revolutionary black nationalist organization led by Huey P. Newton. It is considered as the most influential black movement organization of the 70s. The Black Panther Party's core practice was its armed citizens' patrols to monitor the behavior of police officers and challenge police brutality. The Party fought to establish revolutionary socialism by advocating the use of violence and guerrilla tactics to overthrow the government.21. Why is it important that Jennie's boyfriend is from Berkeley during this time? The University of UC Berkeley was popular among young adults for its civil unrest and protests. There was abundant sex, drugs, and rock n roll. Jennie's boyfriend is part of the counterculture movement - the hippies - which criticizes the Vietnam War and promotes peace and love instead.22. Jennie says that Gump's uniform is a trip. What other trips has Jennie learned to take? What drugs were used during the late 60s and early 70s and are associated with the Hippie movement? Jennie learned to take trips (meaning shes high) by using LSD and other common drugs associated with the hippie movement such as marijuana, methamphetamine, and cocaine.23. When did American astronauts walk on the moon? Apollo 11 astronaut Buzz Aldrin, Neil Armstrong, and Michael Collins walked on the moon in July 1969.24. When was the Captain Kangaroo program on TV? What kind of show was it? Captain Kangaroo is an American children's television series that aired weekday mornings on the American television network CBS for nearly 30 years, from October 3, 1955 until December 6, 1984, making it the longest-running nationally broadcast children's television program of its day.25. Gump meets John Lennon who was John Lennon? John Lennon was a famous British musician, member of the group The Beatles.26. Lt. Dan represents the disgruntled Vietnam War veterans. Why was it difficult for soldiers that returned from Vietnam, esp. compared to WWII veterans? While WWII veterans7/23/2019 Forrest Gump Worksheet 3/3came back as heroes, Vietnam War veterans were perceived as baby killers after atrocities like the Mai Lay Massacre were revealed to the public.27. Why did Lt. Dan say he would be the first mate on Gump's shrimp boat? Lt. Dan didn't believe Gump when he first told him about his plans and made a sarcastic joke. Gump being his only true friend, he nonetheless agrees to support him.28. What does Forrest name his boat? He names his boat Jenny.29. Next we see Jennie in a disco scene. How is her life going? Jenny takes a lot of drugs and is obviously not well (she almost kills herself unconsciously when she tries to jump off her apartment balcony). Dan and returns home to Greenbow when he learns that his mother is dying of cancer. If you're an idiot, he said angrily, how do you know how to do that? Maybe I am an idiot, I said, but I'm not stupid. I was born an idiot, but I'm cleverer than most people think. In its first eighteen days, the film of Forrest Gump took \$100 million in American cinemas more than any other film that Paramount Pictures has made before. Forrest Gump is an unusual man who does a lot of unusual things. Millions of ordinary Americans liked the film. They felt Forrest Gump's story was also partly a story about themselves and about America from the 1960s to today. Forrest Gump lived the American Dream. It doesn't matter if you are rich or poor, you can be anything you want to be. Winston Grooms other books are Better Times Than These, about the war in Vietnam, and As Summers Die. He lives for some of the time in New York City and for the rest of the time in Clear Point, Alabama. iv Chapter 1 School and Football 1 I was born an idiot but I'm cleverer than people think. I can think things OK, but when I have to say them or write them down, sometimes they come out all wrong. When I was born, my Mom named me Forrest. My daddy died just after I was born. He worked on the ships. One day a big box of bananas fell down on my daddy and killed him. I don't like bananas much. Only banana cake. I like that all right. At first when I was growing up, I played with everybody. But then some boys hit me, and my Mom didn't want me to play with them again. I tried to play with girls, but they all ran away from me. I went to an ordinary school for a year. Then the children started laughing and running away from me. But one girl, Jenny Curran, didn't run away, and sometimes she walked home with me. She was nice. Then they put me into another kind of school, and there were some strange boys there. Some couldn't eat or go to the toilet without help. I stayed in that school for five or six years. But when I was thirteen, I grew six inches in six months! And by the time I was sixteen, I was bigger and heavier than all the other boys in the school. One day I was walking home, and a car stopped next to me. The driver asked me my name, and I told him. What school do you go to? he asked. No, I told him. I see other people playing, but I don't play and they never ask me to play with them. OK, the man said. Three days later, the man in the car came and got me out of 1 school. Mom was there, and they got all the things out of my desk and put them in a brown paper bag. Then they told me to say goodbye to the teacher. The man in the car took me and Mom to the new high school. There, an old man with grey hair asked me lots of questions. But I knew that they really wanted me to play football. The man in the car was a football coach called Fellers. Coach Fellers asked me to put on a football suit, then asked me to undress and dress again, twenty times, until I could do it easily. I began to play football with the high school team, and Coach Fellers helped me. And I went to lessons in the school. One teacher, Miss Henderson, was really nice. She taught me to read. And who do you think I saw in the school cafe? Jenny Curran! She was all grown-up now, with pretty black hair, long legs, and a beautiful face. I went and sat with her, and she remembered me! But there was a boy in the cafe who started calling me names, and saying things like, Hows Stupid? Then he threw some milk at me, and I jumped out of my chair and ran away. A day or two later, after school in the afternoon, he and his friends came up to me and started pushing and hitting me. Then they ran after me across the football field. I ran away fast!
